

American security services have reason to be cautious with regard to Iranian nationals/ with dual nationality or residents in the West who regularly travel back and forth to Iran

The threats and perils faced for forty-seven years by a humanist and enlightened writer, fighting superstition, opposing racism and ignorance, while advocating peace.

For 47 years, David Abbasi, writer, author of several books and host of radio and television programs broadcast in several languages, has been the target of threats and acts of intimidation.

(1980-2026) Threats, aggressions and acts of vandalism . He has never felt fully safe, including in France. From 1980 until 2026, he has faced repeated threats, smear campaigns, pressure, physical and verbal assaults, as well as attacks targeting his studios, his radio-television offices and his cultural activities. He has been the victim of attempts at economic sabotage intended to weaken his financial resources and hinder his cultural projects. His office located in the Champs-Élysées district in Paris has suffered more than ten acts of damage. Individuals attempted to enter the premises by forcing the door and the lock. He also states that the offices suffered significant water damage coming from the pipes of the common areas of the building. Assault on his family when he is in the United States

In April 2026, David Abbasi went to the United States to participate in a conference devoted to global security, peace and threats linked to fundamentalism.

Three days after his arrival in Los Angeles, his wife, accompanied by their 13-year-old son, in Paris, was reportedly assaulted and threatened by four hooded individuals.. Thanks to the testimonies of several people present at the scene, one of the suspects was reportedly identified and then apprehended by the authorities.

A campaign of economic asphyxiation denounced since 2008

In 2008, an individual presented as an agent of the Islamic Republic of Iran created a Facebook page calling to "economically annihilate" his activities and promising remuneration to anyone participating in this campaign.

This individual, who had participated in money laundering operations for the benefit of Iranian officials from Silicon Valley, was reportedly subsequently arrested by the American authorities. Despite this arrest, the campaign of economic asphyxiation continued.

The original Facebook page is still accessible and continues to allow the recruitment of people likely to participate in actions of economic destabilization against him. Although this page today has less than forty subscribers, he believes he continues to suffer the consequences of this campaign.

In 1981, Islamists attacked the premises of his newspaper in Mashhad as well as his home. Several young collaborators and supporters of the newspaper were arrested and executed. (Erchad.com)

This event forced Mr. Abbasi to leave Iran.

Tens of thousands of people have been victims of the repressive regime of the ayatollahs since the 1980s, including Mr. Abbasi's father and many supporters of the newspaper, as well as thousands of supporters of the Shah of Iran, and other political movements.

On April 6, 1982, the Islamic Revolutionary Tribunal of Mashhad published a statement in the press summoning Mr. Abbasi to appear within fifteen days, failing which he would be judged in absentia. (Document No. 1)

In March 1982, he settled in Paris, where he continued his activity as a writer and journalist. (Document No. 2)

To date, he has written more than 140 books, thousands of articles in several languages, as well as more than 7,000 radio and television programs. (iran.pm)

1985 – 1988: 3 physical assaults linked to his books Following the publication of his books From Mithra to Muhammad and Religion and Rationalism, he was assaulted and injured in **August 1985 and then in July 1986**, near the avenue d'Iéna and the Eiffel Tower.

The assailants took refuge in the embassy of the Islamic Republic of Iran. Mr. Abbasi was hospitalized and filed a complaint. (Document No. 3, 5 pages)

On March 2, 1988, after the publication of I dreamed of God, he cried like a baby and The Secrets of Islam, he was again assaulted, this time by the nephew of the President of the Islamic Republic of Iran (current Supreme Leader), in the premises of the newspaper Étoile, 183 rue Championnet, Paris 18th.

The assailant was arrested. (Police receipt — Document No. 4)

1992 – 1997: police warnings and assassinations

In 1992, on the eve of the birth of his daughter Morgane, the police station of Noisy-le-Grand informed Mr. Abbasi that his life was threatened. Gendarmes then protected his home, 131 avenue Émile-Cossonneau.

On May 27, 1996, Reza Mazlouman, alias "Kourosh AriaManesh", former vice-minister of Education of the Shah of Iran, friend and collaborator of Mr. Abbasi, was assassinated at his home in Créteil.

In 1996, following the assassination of two collaborators of David at the newspaper and radio AvaIran.com, Dr. Reza Mazlouman, former vice-minister of Education of the Shah of Iran exiled in France, and Professor Assemi, President of the Academy of Tajikistan in Dushanbe, a director of the DST (Directorate of Territorial Surveillance) presented himself at Mr. Abbasi's office, 66 avenue des Champs-Élysées, to inform him that precise information confirmed an imminent threat against his life. The ministry then once again decided to place him under close protection, with bodyguard officers from the Ministry of the Interior and an armored vehicle.

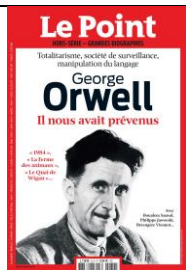
In 1997, while he was a writer, historian, journalist and radio-television host, publishing from Paris (Erchad, Homa), London (Nimrooz), Los Angeles (Asre Emrouz and Ferdowsi), Toronto (Payam) and Vancouver (Iranian) (www.awesta.fr), the Islamic Republic of Iran launched a vast propaganda campaign by promoting a general of the Revolutionary Guards, named "Abbasi" (real name Yadollah Ghazvini), to tarnish the image and discredit the secular and rational work of the real Mr. Abbasi, based in Paris...

In March 2005, during a live broadcast, a host told him: "Tomorrow morning, when leaving the radio, I will empty my pistol on your head."

The trials held before European courts concerning the assassinations of Shapour Bakhtiar, Reza Mazlouman, Cyrus Elahi, Fereydoun Farrokhzad, Sadegh Sharafkandi, Kazem Radjavi, Naghdi and many other Iranian opponents have highlighted the involvement of agents of the Islamic Republic of Iran in several of these cases. Several people have been found guilty and convicted by the competent courts.

According to David Abbasi, these judicial cases confirm the warnings he has been issuing for many years concerning the activities of the Iranian intelligence services (Secret Organization of Allah's Espionage) in Europe and the methods employed by them.

With the increasing recourse of the Islamic Republic of Iran to allied countries, proxy groups and Shiite militias of different nationalities, the direct role of Iranian nationals in certain operations is said to have diminished over the years.

Several judicial proceedings conducted before European courts have shown that, in certain cases linked to operations attributed to the Iranian regime, perpetrators or intermediaries were not of Iranian nationality. This evolution is often interpreted as the use of transnational networks making it possible to reduce the direct involvement of Iranian citizens.
